Water Levels

Water levels are important to most if not all of us on Crystal Lake. The CEWF, one of the organizations that the CLCA supports is in regular contact with the Trent Severn Waterway (TSW) water management team.

The CEWF has recently reported that total precipitation for this past winter was 25% less than normal values followed by 25%-50% less than normal amounts of precipitation in March. As you may have noticed, the lake level is quite low. However, we can expect the current lake levels to gradually rise during the month of May, reaching seasonal averages heading into summer. Hoping for some rain!

Over the course of the season, if you happen to notice that a buoy has become loose, damaged or you find one floating, please leave it on your dock or shore plainly visible and one of the volunteers will pick it up and place it back out as soon as they can.

Short-Term Rentals

As you know, the Municipality of Trent Lakes has been exploring the introduction of a short-term rental licensing program.

We recognize that this is an important issue to many of you and that there will be a range of perspectives on the matter. We thank those of you who have provided comments to date by email, through our Facebook site as well as in conversation with us. We will continue to take forward any of the feedback you provide to us. We feel such a proposal requires public consultation and should be guided and informed by all property owners and their perspectives.

At this time, the Municipality of Trent Lakes has deferred work on this until the Fall of 2021. We will continue to keep you up to date.

We are creating some resources that will be made available to all of you including a pamphlet for those renting your property with information on the lake and area as well as guide to successful short-term rentals.

Our Loons

The loons are back on the lake and they will be getting ready to mate and nest. A recent study has shown that loon populations are declining, with major causes being loss of habitat and water levels. There are a few simple things we can all do to protect our loons including:

- Watch your wake, the lake levels are generally high during mating and nesting season, one wave can flood a nest and destroy the eggs, meaning the pair will have no chicks for that year. Please avoid activities that cause large wakes near shore (May and June).
- Respect their space. If you see a nest, stay clear,
- don't try to get close to adults or chicks.
- Try and leave shorelines as natural as possible,
- particularly if you have property in small bays/inlets frequented by loons.

OPP Patrol

The OPP patrol both our lake and roads during the day and night. Know and follow the rules of the lake and road. For more information on safe boating visit the Transport Canada website.

- ✓ We keep the welcome signs and various planters looking beautiful.

- \checkmark We purchase and maintain buoys to mark some of the rocks and shoals on Crystal Lake.

- ✓ We promote and support local businesses and events.

CLCA acts as a liaison and represents waterfront and area residents on various important matters that arise in the community that may impact us.

- We liaise with the Municipality of Trent Lakes Council and staff regarding waste management, roadway maintenance, septic inspection program and environmental and development concerns.
- ✓ We support the Crystal Lake Steward who takes water samples to be tested by the Ministry of the Environment to monitor the water quality of the lake for clarity, phosphorus levels and invasive species (i.e. zebra mussels).


We also maintain membership with various associations so we can provide a united voice on behalf of our members on important matters including:

✓ Coalition for Equitable Water Flow (CEWF):

- Work to implement equitable water management policy for the Trent-Severn Waterway taking all those affected into account.
- Water levels are important to us on Crystal Lake and we encourage you to visit the <u>CEWF's website</u> for more information.

✓ Federation of Ontario Cottagers' Associations (FOCA):

- A non-profit, voluntary organization that represents over 500 Ontario cottage associations at the provincial level, dedicated to supporting the interests of Ontario's waterfront property owners.
 - FOCA is an active supporter of:
 - Waterfront Ratepayers After Fair Taxation (WRAFT) which is a coalition of waterfront associations across Ontario working to achieve equity in waterfront property taxation; and
 - Coalition After Property Tax Reform (CAPTR) which is an alliance of over 700 ratepayer organizations striving to bring
 equity and stability to residential property tax system.






Lake Steward

- Consider supporting your local ATV association and become a member in order to enjoy full use of the trails Have fun!!!



Friendly Reminders

- ✓ Watch your boat wake! Be considerate of docks, watercraft, and shorelines.
- We share the lake and roads with many of nature's creatures both big and small.
 Please respect all forms of wildlife.
- Always be respectful of your neighbours (e.g. off road vehicles, music, fireworks, lighting, pets etc.).
- Always use caution when having any type of fire. See the rules & regulations at <u>http://www.trentlakes.ca/services/firerescue/</u>
- ✓ Be Bear Wise! Check out <u>www.bears.mnr.gov.on.ca</u>
- Know your 911 information in case of emergency. Please ensure that your 911 number is visible and in good shape. Remove all old Crystal Lake numbers to avoid confusion.
- Ob you rent your property? Some things to consider include:
 - ✓ Adequate parking for guests (i.e. no parking on private or municipal roads)
 - ✓ Advertise only for the number of bedrooms your septic tank permits.
 - Be available 24 hours a day for renters or make arrangements for someone else to be.
 - ✓ Ensure guests are aware of by-laws and laws (i.e. noise, fireworks, boating).

Website Traffic

We just wanted to share some interesting information about web traffic on our CLCA website. During the past year (March 2020 to February 2021), the CLCA website has seen an increase in traffic. The website recorded an average of 77,400+ hits/month. There were approximately 10,700 visits/month (compared to 4,500/month last year), and 42,500 pages viewed/month (compared to 8,200/month last year) – so the CLCA internet "presence" continues at a very high rate!

You may also be interested that Google Search has recorded approximately 109,000+ impressions for www.crystallakecottagers.ca over the past year (compared to 103,000 last year). An impression is recorded when 'www.crystallakecottagers.ca' appears in a Google search result for a user, regardless of what they searched for. (This is a result of our regular website submittals to major search engines).

As of January 1, 2019, we developed a new website tracking system for CLCA web site using Google Analytics. Among other things, this allows us to see the individual selected page visits and also 'click-through' events. This is a helpful way for us to see what is our most popular pages are on the web site.
