Septic Tank Inspections

As we have shared with you, the Peterborough County-City Health Unit (PCCHU) is conducting inspections of septic tanks throughout the entire municipality. The intent of this program is to protect our surface water and groundwater quality from being affected by poorly functioning septic systems.

Inspections will be focused on sewage systems installed more than 5 years ago. The cycle of inspections has spanned several years with a different area of the municipality being inspected each year. This year Crystal Lake is one of the areas included in the inspections. Property owners will be notified by mail when their system is being considered for inspection, which some of you have already received. Systems being considered for inspection will go through a vetting process to determine if they require inspection.

PCCHU staff will be attending our upcoming Annual General Meeting AGM on Sunday June 3, 2018 to give a presentation and answer any questions you may have. We encourage you all to attend.

Waste Management Update

As you know, effective January 1, 2017, the Municipality of Trent Lakes, launched a mandatory Clear Garbage Bag program and also moved to a new waste management card. The purpose of this program is to discourage the placement of recyclables and hazardous materials into the waste stream. This was a new process for all of us but together we have helped to divert waste.

As a reminder, at the Crystal Lake Transfer Site, in addition to your household garbage and recycling, you can drop off: household, rechargeable batteries, hard plastics, electronics, light bulbs and florescent tubes, wood and wood chips, used clothing, liquor bottles and cans etc.

New this year you can discard vehicle and boat batteries, motor oil and anti-freeze. We are also working with other area association to encourage the addition of green organics at the waste transfer site. This will be an important addition as it will further reduce the waste going into the bins.

Public Works Garage

The Municipality of Trent Lakes is proposing to build a centralized public works garage/depot instead of rebuilding the existing site on Galway Road. If the proposal is approved it would mean the permanent closure of the garage/depot on Galway Road and all trucks and equipment will operate from a central location in Bobcaygeon or Buckhorn. This would have serious consequences for us including a decrease in services particularly grading and plowing.

We continue to work with Cavendish, GARAI and other municipal associations to oppose this proposal.

What does the CLCA do?

CLCA focuses on and represents the interests of Crystal Lake waterfront property and area residents.

- We keep the welcome signs and various planters looking beautiful.
- We offer discount cards for use at local businesses for CLCA members.
- We support Crystal Lake events such as the Crystal Lake Triathlon, Rock Bass Derby and the upcoming Canada Day Family Event.
- We purchase and maintain buoys to mark some of the rocks and shoals on Crystal Lake.
- We maintain a website and Facebook page to keep us informed, share events, photos and other interesting stuff!
- We make donations to and support other local volunteer organizations.

CLCA acts as a liaison and represents waterfront and area residents on various important matters that arise in the community that may impact us.

- We liaise with the Municipality of Trent Lakes Council and staff regarding waste management, roadway maintenance, septic inspection program and environmental and development concerns.
- We support the Crystal Lake Steward who takes water samples to be tested by the Ministry of the Environment to monitor the water quality of the lake for clarity, phosphorus levels and invasive species (i.e. zebra mussels).

We also maintain membership with various associations so we can provide a united voice on behalf of our members on important matters including:

✓ Coalition for Equitable Water Flow (CEWF):

- Work to implement equitable water management policy for the Trent-Severn Waterway taking all those affected into account.
- Water levels are important to us on Crystal Lake and we encourage you to visit the <u>CEWF's website</u> for more information.

✓ Federation of Ontario Cottagers' Associations (FOCA):

- a non-profit, voluntary organization that represents over 500 Ontario cottage associations at the provincial level, dedicated to supporting the interests of Ontario's waterfront property owners.
- FOCA is an active supporter of:
 - Waterfront Ratepayers After Fair Taxation (WRAFT) which is a coalition of waterfront associations across Ontario working to achieve equity in waterfront property taxation; and
 - Coalition After Property Tax Reform (CAPTR) which is an alliance of over 700 ratepayer organizations striving to bring equity and stability to residential property tax system.

✓ Galway and Area Ratepayers Association Incorporated (GARAI):

- a community based organization, dedicated to working with area associations, residents, businesses and local township to find solutions to issues that are common among property owners in our area.
- An active Environment Committee who coordinate the Turtle Crossing & Adopt-A-Road Programs.

Friendly Reminders

- Watch your boat wake! Be considerate of docks, water craft, and shorelines. Also, please go 'dead slow' in potential loon nesting areas or avoid these areas completely. This is especially important when spring water levels are high. Just one wave can kill the hatchlings.
- We share the lake and roads with many of nature's creatures both big and small (see our wildlife inventory posted on our website). Please respect all forms of wildlife.
- 3. Always be respectful of your neighbours (e.g. 4-wheelers, music, fireworks, lighting, pets etc.).
- 4. Always use caution when having any type of fire. See the rules & regulations at http://www.trentlakes.ca/services/fire-rescue/
- 5. Be Bear Wise! Check out www.bears.mnr.gov.on.ca
- Know your 911 information in case of emergency. Please ensure that your 911 number is visible and in good shape. Remove all old Crystal Lake numbers to avoid confusion.
